Beach Jumpers Storm Ocracoke Island, N.C.

October 22, 2009

News Flash

U.S. Navy Beach Jumpers stormed Ocracoke Island in the early morning hours today. BJ's from all war eras, World War II, Korea and Viet Nam overtook the Ocracoke Community Center on Irvin Garrish Highway and set up their headquarters. They immediately began to stock the center with supplies, rations and munitions. Yes munitions, silver bullet cans and the like. After the arrival of the initial landing party, more BJs began to converge on the center. Their numbers just continued to increase all day long.

"Turbo Vestri Hostilis" was heard all over the island, but the residents were not sure what that meant. We would later find out that the BJs weren't trying to confuse their enemies, but had come back to the island after 66 years to talk about some of their once classified secret missions during World War II and to dedicate a Memorial Marker to the memory of all Navy

Beach Jumpers who had served in units between 1943 and 1972. The official dedication ceremony would take place on Friday October 24, 2009 at the Ocracoke Museum grounds on Water Street, followed by the official marker unveiling at Loop Shack Hill. The residents were so pleased to find out that they weren't under attack and welcomed the BJs with open arms and Ocracoke Island hospitality.

Everyone was invited back to the Community Center, after the unveiling, for light lunch refreshments. Kudos to Darlene and her team from Fig Tree Deli for a wonderful meal.

When the Beach Jumpers Articles of Association and By-Laws were first drawn and adopted the primary goal and objective of the Association was to perpetuate the recognition and memory of Navy Beach Jumpers.

Well, we finally did it on Ocracoke Island, NC we placed the first Memorial Marker for Beach Jumpers. Tourists and residents will be able to read some of the untold and unrecognized history on the marker as they visit Loop Shack Hill. The marker is located at the base of the hill, where World War II Beach Jumpers trained before being deployed throughout the world on their secret missions.

Loop Shack Hill was recently listed in the Federal Registry of protected lands and is currently maintained by the National Park Service.
